




ZOPACAS: Brazil's South Atlantic Project

 Created in 1987, Brazilian initiative in the UN

 Goal: reinforce links between South Atlantic members and ensure "peace and security" in the region




- Project "Revitalized" in the mid-2000s


Raising Maritime Insecurity in the South Atlantic
